Data from the Along-Track Scanning Radiometer instruments (ATSR-1, ATSR-2 and AATSR) are available to registered NEODC users based in the UK subject to the following conditions:

DATA PROTECTION ACT

Information submitted in application for access to the data will be made available to:

- The Natural Environment Research Council (NERC), and its delegated authorities, i.e. the NERC Earth Observation Data Centre and the British Atmospheric Data Centre (BADC) and their host organisation, the Science and Technology Facilities Council (STFC)
- The European Space Agency (ESA)

for the purposes of tracking data usage and of improving the service.

PURPOSE OF USE

The data are only to be used for *bona fide* academic research or educational purposes by UK users. For commercial applications of ATSR and data derived from ESA satellites, or for requests from non-UK users please contact the <u>ESA EO Helpdesk</u> who deal with international and potential commercial usage.

OWNERSHIP AND ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

The data, processed from ESA raw data, remain the joint property of NERC and STFC (and Defra in the case of AATSR) and may NOT be sold or otherwise passed on to a third party. Where the data are used in a presentation or publication, an acknowledgement MUST be given:

A sentence should be given along the lines of - "Data from the (A)ATSR instruments are provided courtesy of the Natural Environment Research Council, STFC Rutherford Appleton Laboratory, the European Space Agency and Defra, through the NERC Earth Observation Data Centre (NEODC)."

DETAILS OF PRESENTATIONS AND PUBLICATIONS

This information is required for the Data Centre's Annual Report to the NERC and will be requested at the end of each calendar year.
